Cocktails!

The Catskills Alcohol Consumption Index

Season Two was a goldmine for cocktails! The Gin Rickey, Tom Collins, the Napoleon, and Martinis all make an appearance. Look to the Catskills for cocktail inspiration!

Classic Tom Collins

- Juice of 1/2 a lemon
- 1 Teaspoon powdered sugar **
- 2 oz Gin
- Carbonated water
- Slices of lemon and orange
- Maraschino cherry

Shake the gin, lemon juice, and powdered sugar with ice in a cocktail shaker, and strain into a 12 oz glass. Add a few cubes of ice and fill with carbonated water. Stir. Garnish with slices of lemon and orange, and a maraschino cherry.

**simple syrup or agave could be substituted for the powdered sugar if you prefer, but vintage home bartending guides often suggest this common pantry ingredient.



Lemon flavored cocktails or classic lemonade are always crowd pleasers too.

Classic Napoleon

- 2 oz Gin
- 1/2 Teaspoon curacao
- 1 Teaspoon dubonnet

Stir well with ice and strain into a 3 oz. cocktail glass.

The Tart Cherry Gin Rickey is one of my favorite twists on the classic.

Classic Gin Rickey

- 1 Cube of ice
- Juice of half a lime
- 1.5 oz Gin
- Carbonated water

Fill an 8 oz highball glass with ice and the above ingredients. Top with carbonated water, and stir.

Tart Cherry Gin Rickey

- Juice of half a lime
- 1.5 oz Gin
- 1.5 oz Tart cherry juice
- 1/2 Teaspoon agave nectar
- Lime flavored sparkling water
- Ice

Place ice in a cocktail shaker. Add gin, cherry juice, agave, and lime juice.
Shake! Strain into an ice filled glass. Top with lime flavored sparkling water and lime wedges.

A Twist on Cooper's Ranch Punch

- 2 oz pink grapefruit juice (about 1 grapefruit if making with fresh juice)
- 2 oz pineapple juice
- Juice of 1 lime
- 1/2 teaspoon grenadine
- 2 oz white rum
- Sparkling water

Add ice to a cocktail shaker. Place all the ingredients except the sparkling water into the shaker. Shake. Pour into an ice filled glass. Top with sparkling water and stir.

Create the garnish with half a strawberry, a slice of pineapple, a pineapple leaf, and a paper umbrella. See how I created it **HERE**.




Food!

Proscuitto Roll-ups

- Twelve pieces of prosciutto
- 2 oz cream cheese, softened
- ½ teaspoon horseradish
- 24 pickles such as sweet gherkins, okra, etc.

Combine the softened cream cheese and horseradish. Cut the proscuitto pieces in half and spread one side with the cream cheese and horseradish mixture. Wrap around a pickle. Spear with a toothpick. Enjoy!

Creating a sandwich bar is a quick and easy way to cater to different tastes and dietary restrictions. Choose a couple of meats, cheeses, and bread options. Don't forget a variety of veggies, mustard and the pickles!


